

Precertification Program Hawaii Electricians Health and Welfare Fund

The Hawaii Electricians Health and Welfare Fund health plan requires precertification of hospital admissions and various outpatient services and procedures. Please note that **failure to obtain precertification may result in a reduction of benefits.**

To obtain precertification: Mail or fax a completed **Precertification Request Form** along with supporting clinical documentation at least two (2) business days prior to the planned surgery and/or admission; or within forty-eight (48) hours of an emergent admission. Forms are available at hwmg.org. **Hospitals:** Submit the **Admission Face Sheet** to our Health Management (HM) Department within the time frames stated above.
